

**RESOLUTION APPOINTING KENNY McLAUGHLIN TO THE ASHTABULA COUNTY BOARD OF DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES**

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 5126.02 of the Ohio Revised Code the Ashtabula County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities was created to plan and set priorities based on available resources for the provision of facilities, programs, and other services to meet the needs of county residents who are individuals with mental retardation and other developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, The Board consists of seven members, five of whom are appointed by the Board of Commissioners with terms of the members set at four (4) years; and

WHEREAS, Kim Ryel has previously submitted her resignation, creating a vacancy on said board which is now necessary to fill; and

WHEREAS, Kenny McLaughlin has expressed a desire to be appointed to the Ashtabula County DD Board and the Board of Commissioners concurs for a term commencing immediately and ending January 19, 2022 and/or the date of the organizational meeting of the Board of DD; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Commissioners of Ashtabula County, Ohio, that Kenny McLaughlin is appointed to fulfill the term left open by the resignation of Kim Ryel to the Ashtabula County Board of Development Disabilities, as outlined above.
