

**RESOLUTION APPOINTING AMANDA MILLS TO THE ASHTABULA COUNTY BOARD OF DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES (DD)**

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 5126.02 of the Ohio Revised Code the Ashtabula County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities was created to plan and set priorities based on available resources for the provision of facilities, programs, and other services to meet the needs of county residents who are individuals with intellectual developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, The Board consists of seven members, five of whom are appointed by the Board of Commissioners with terms of members being set at four (4) years; and

WHEREAS, Michele Davis submitted her resignation creating a vacancy on said board which is now necessary to fill; and

WHEREAS, Amanda Mills has expressed a desire to be appointed to the Ashtabula County Board of DD and the Board of Commissioners concurs for a term commencing immediately and ending January 19, 2029 and/or on the date of the organizational meeting of the Board of DD to fulfill the term of Michele Davis; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Commissioners of Ashtabula County, Ohio, that Amanda Mills is hereby appointed to the Ashtabula County Board of Development Disabilities for the term outlined above.


